> When you compare one subject to another, you show how the two are alike, or similar.

- The dog, like the cat, is a household pet.
- Both dogs and cats are household pets.
- Dogs, as well as cats, are household pet.

B. Key words commonly used to express contrast include:

When you contrast two subjects, you show how they are different.

- The dog, **unlike** the cat, is dependent on its master.
- While the dog is dependent on its master, the cat is not.
- The dog is dependent on its master, **but** the cat is not.

Sometimes, both comparison and contrast are used in the same sentence.

- Both dogs and cats make good household pets, but a dog requires more attention than a cat.
- Dogs, as well as cats, make good household pets; however, dogs are dependent on their owners while cats are not.
