Making Questions with Be/Do/Have

In English, we can use the auxiliary verbs **BE**, **DO** and **HAVE** to form **Yes/No questions**. Follow these rules to know which one to use in your questions.

Use:

 If there is a <u>main verb</u> in the sentence, then we use **DO** to form the question. (Do/Does/Did)

Example:

- Do you <u>like</u> chocolate? → Yes, I <u>like</u> chocolate.
- Does Monica <u>live</u> in Victoria? → No, she <u>lives</u> in Calgary.
- **Did** they \underline{qo} to the mall yesterday? \rightarrow No, they \underline{went} to the mall on Sunday.
- 2. If there isn't a main verb but <u>be-verb</u> is in the sentence, we use **BE-VERB** to form the question. (Am/Is/Are/Was/Were)

Example:

- Are you hungry? → Yes, I <u>am</u> hungry.
- **Is** he at school today? → No, he **is not** at school today.
- Were they students at Camosun last semester? → Yes, they were students at Camosun last semester.
- 3. When we use the perfect tense, we use HAVE as the auxiliary verb to form the question. When have is the auxiliary verb, you will also need to use the past participle verb. (Have/Had)

Example:

- Have you <u>eaten</u> breakfast? → Yes, I <u>have eaten</u> breakfast.
- Have they been to Australia? → No, they haven't been to Australia.
- Has he <u>seen</u> the movie already? → Yes, he <u>has seen</u> the movie already.

Structure:

BE, DO and HAVE auxiliary verbs come at the beginning of the sentence and are followed by the subject. If there is a main verb, this will come after your subject.

Example:

Auxiliary Verb	Subject	Main Verb	Rest of Sentence
Do	you	want	to go to the mall?
Does	Maria	speak	Spanish?
Are	they		your friends?
Was	Mark		at school this morning?
Have	we	decided	where to go?
Has	Josh	been	to Disneyland?
