## Compound Sentences with (and, but, so)

We use (and, but, so) to join two sentences together and make a <u>compound sentence</u>.

Example: I love cats. I also love drinking coffee. → two complete sentences with Subject + Verb + Object.

❖ To make a longer sentence, I can join these two sentences with a conjunction.

Example: I love cats, and I also love drinking coffee.

And = extra or more information  $\rightarrow$  I am a teacher, and I am a mother.

But = contrast or opposite information  $\rightarrow$  I am tired, but I have to go to work.

**So = result**  $\rightarrow$  I am hungry, <u>so</u> I will eat lunch now.
